

## **Arrowhead Architectural Committee**

May 6, 2008

In attendance: Adam Kral, Terry Moore, Bill Bernard, Richard Cothorn, Mark Rasmus, Bruce Wholf, Cathy Redford and Jennifer McCready.

A motion by Mark Rasmus to approve the minutes of the April 15, 2008 meeting was seconded by Terry Moore and carried.

Adam Kral submitted a request for new signage for Bayer, Papay & Steiner sign to add Dr. Brochin, DDS. After discussion the request was tabled until a product sample could be looked at.

Jeff Normand of Normand Associates submitted a request for approval of the site plan, building elevation and materials for a new 3,800 square foot dental office on Longbow Drive. After discussion, Mark Rasmus moved to approve the site plan, building elevation and materials for Biniker Dental as presented. Bruce Wholf seconded the motion, which carried unanimously. Jeff Normand will return at a later date to seek approval for an outside storage shed, landscaping and site lighting.

Adam Kral submitted a request for temporary signage for Barneys. After discussion, Mark Rasmus moved to approve the temporary location of the Barney's sign in front of Suffolk Square shopping center as presented and that on or before 60 days following the completion of the Dussel Drive widening project the permanent sign will be presented for approval to the architectural committee and installed. Richard Cothorn seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Bruce Wholf made a motion to cover all previously approved temporary signage on Dussel Drive to follow the same sign rule as Barneys; being that no later than 60 days following the completion of the Dussel Drive widening project the temporary signs be removed and the request for permanent signage will be presented to the architectural committee for approval and installed. Terry Moore seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.
